Grand Rapids and Perugia have collaborated for 25 years, and we celebrate the deep connection between the Sister Cities.

Programs include:

- The Angela Ryan – UNISTRA Scholarship which sends two students or residents to Perugia each year to study Italian language and culture.
- Annual scholarships to University of Perugia students who participate in an exchange program with the GVSU Political Science Department.
- There is a music partnership through St. Cecilia Music Center.
- The committee co-sponsors a Perugian artist to participate in ArtPrize each year.
- Volunteers travel to Perugia to staff a booth at the Perugia Sister City Market attended by more than 50,000 visitors from Perugia and greater Europe.
- Elementary school age children have maintained a pen pal program since 2007.
- To regularly further Italian culture and language, the committee facilitates monthly meetings of Club Italia.

In the evening, our group will gather at one of the city's best restaurants where the renowned chef-owner will welcome our group and lead us in a culinary introduction to Umbrian cuisine. A representative from the City of Perugia will also join the group and officially welcome the Grand Rapids Delegation to their Sister City.

DAY 2: MONDAY OCTOBER 15

Enjoy the deluxe buffet breakfast at Hotel Brufani this morning as you will each day of the trip. Then we'll set out for a walking tour of the fascinating historic center of Perugia accompanied by a fun and knowledgeable local guide. We'll be introduced to several of Perugia's most important landmarks and institutions.

Once you've been introduced to Grand Rapids' beautiful and dynamic Italian sister city, the time has come to celebrate that special relationship. You are cordially invited to Perugia City Hall for the 25th Anniversary Ceremony with the Mayors of Perugia and Grand Rapids and Perugia City Council. There the Sister City agreement will be signed amidst the requisite pomp and circumstance, accompanied of course by plenty of good cheer which will continue into the official celebratory lunch following the ceremony.

Take some time this afternoon to explore Perugia on your own or relax and unwind at the hotel. Explore the city's mix of museums, art galleries, and public squares. Tonight there is a special event in store, a wine pairing dinner in the Umbrian countryside at a castle that seems straight out of a fairytale.

A Day of Living History

DAY 3: TUESDAY OCTOBER 16

This morning our delegation will visit the Perugian elementary school that is involved in an exchange with a class at the St. Paul Elementary School in Grand Rapids. These children will be excited to meet our group and we will converse with educators and learn about the education system in Italy.

Then our group will be privileged to experience living history at the Giuditta Brozzetti Handweaving Laboratory, located inside a former thirteenth century church where Saint Francis and his disciples once lived and prayed. The passionate, fourth generation proprietor will treat our group to a private tour and demonstration of traditional Umbrian hand weaving techniques.

Enjoy lunch on your own in Perugia today and then we are off to Assisi. Our local guide will lead us around this legendary place of pilgrimage, the birthplace of St. Francis of Assisi. A highlight of our tour will be a visit to the massive Basilica of St Francis, built in the 13th century in the Gothic style, and decorated inside with stunning Giotto frescoes.

Near Assisi is the very special Agriturismo Le Mandrie di San Paolo, where we'll learn about olive oil extraction and have the opportunity to taste the just-pressed olive oil from this year's harvest. Then the proprietors will serve us a multi-course rustic Umbrian meal, bursting with fresh seasonal flavors. As our Perugian hosts have advised, this is a "dream place," and dining this evening in a picturesque eleventh century farmhouse will surely be extraordinary.

DAY 4: WEDNESDAY OCTOBER 17

This morning we will have a special visit at the National Gallery of Umbria, home to an internationally renowned collection. Perugia has a rich and important artistic tradition, so a visit to the National Gallery will foster a deeper connection to this place. We will also visit the University for Foreigners, where thousands of international students study Italian language and culture. The University has a sister cities scholarship program and students from Grand Rapids attend each year.

Midday we will drive to Gubbio, sometimes called the Umbrian Siena, this is a destination decidedly off the beaten tourist path and a place where we can see locals going about everyday life in the heart of this lovely, preserved Medieval hilltop town. Lunch in Gubbio will be one to remember: a feast centered on truffles, the prized gastronomic jewel of Umbria, and perfectly in season at the time of our visit. After lunch our local guide will lead us through his favorite corners of this enchanting place.

We'll return to Perugia in the afternoon. Enjoy the rest of the day as you like.

A Day on the Lake

DAY 5: THURSDAY OCTOBER 18

Today will be set out to enjoy the fresh air at Lake Trasimeno, Italy's fourth largest lake and an ideal place to experience the natural beauty of Umbria. How you spend this morning is up to you - you may visit the saffron workshop on the banks of the lake to learn the traditional process of growing, harvesting and drying saffron, or join a leisurely guided cycle ride beside Lake Trasimeno.

Then, we'll board a private boat for a cruise around the lake accompanied by a guide who will teach us about the fascinating ecology of this stunning body of water while we enjoy a light lunch.

In the afternoon we'll make our way to the small town of Deruta, the center of the revered local ceramics industry that has flourished here since the Middle Ages. You'll have time to visit the fantastic Museo della Ceramica and, if you like, purchase a handmade souvenir from the many boutique pottery shops. We'll stay in Deruta through the evening, as the guests at a fantastic little osteria run by a wonderfully gregarious family team. Chef Luigi, along with his wife and father, will welcome us into the kitchen as friends for a special cooking class focused on seasonal Umbrian specialties followed by a delightful dinner party with plenty of wine and plenty of laughs.

Exploring Orvieto

DAY 6: FRIDAY OCTOBER 19

The most beloved of the Umbrian hilltop towns is certainly Orvieto. You may already be familiar with the variety of wine named for the town and grown in the hills around it. We'll spend the entire day and evening in Orvieto today. Our first stop is the awe-inspiring Duomo of Orvieto. Built in the 14th century, this imposing cathedral is an undeniable monument to human creativity and our guided tour this morning will be a highlight of the entire week.

After a delicious lunch of local products in a small gastronomic boutique (just wait until you try the olive oil!) we have a special treat in order - our local guide will take us to a hidden section of the fascinating Orvieto Underground. This vast network of subterranean streets, caves and passageways dates back to ancient times and was dug over many centuries. Today it offers a valuable look back at life thousands of years ago.

In the evenings Orvieto is a vibrant place, the small corridors and alleyways are alive with twinkling lights and strolling shoppers. So you'll have a few hours to enjoy the evening in Orvieto as you like, whether you want to settle in to a wine bar, peruse the boutiques, or enjoy a gourmet dinner.

DAY 7: SATURDAY OCTOBER 20

If you can't already tell by the heading.... Our last day in Perugia will be sweet and decadent. The end of our tour coincides with the annual Eurochocolate festival—by now the streets of Perugia will have been overtaken with the continent's largest chocolate festival. Enjoy the revelry today, our hotel is right in the heart of it all.

In the mid-afternoon we bid Perugia *arrivederci* and begin our journey back to Rome Fiumicino Airport, albeit with some special stops along the way. First, we will visit a delightful Umbrian winery for an exclusive tour and tasting. This family owned winery offers many varieties unique to the region and you'll enjoy tasting them and learning about the winemaking operation here and the people behind it.

A bit further down the road is the family-owned gourmet dining destination where we'll enjoy a farewell feast together. Twin brothers manage the restaurant, with one in front of house and one in the kitchen - the chef twin is something of an artist and the restaurant has especially made a name for itself from his creative, whimsical and over-the-top dessert creations. We'll raise a glass of Umbrian wine tonight, to toast our traveling companions and these two special cities that have formed an enduring bond for over 25 years.
