Arrive in Lisbon by midday today and check in to Art Legacy Hotel in the heart of the Portuguese capital city's historic Baixa-Chiado neighborhood. We will meet mid-afternoon and then we're off with Andreia, the Lisboeta who we will be our local guide throughout our time in her native city. Andreia owns a small tuk tuk tour company and her slogan is: Always Talkin', Always Singin', Always Smilin'. We are going to have fun with her! Together in our caravan of tuk tuks we'll tour the hilly city of Lisbon, taking in the great views, learning some interesting history, and getting oriented geographically as we go. Of course we have to stop along the way for a first taste of that fantastic local vinho verde wine and a snack to go with it.

Let's take a little time to freshen up back at the hotel and then we'll set out for a delightful welcome dinner near our hotel. Toast your travel friends new and old over a lovely meal of Portuguese specialties as we get ready for the fabulous and fascinating week that awaits.

Meals Dinner

Portugal from Many Angles DAY 2: MONDAY SEPTEMBER 28

- · Meet a farmer whose family has produced cork for over 180 years
- · Behold the tower that once welcomed Portugal's explorers home

Enjoy breakfast at the hotel as you will each morning of the tour. Afterwards we bid the city adeus as we make our way via private minibus into the Alentejo region in the country's interior where we'll learn about one of Portugal's most iconic industries: cork production. Portugal produces more than 50% of the world's cork, mostly used for wine bottling, and Alentejo is the epicenter of the cork oak forests. Cork oak trees are prized in Portugal, not only are they designated as the country's national tree, it's even illegal to chop one down! Today we're going to meet a cork farmer and learn about these special trees, including how cork is harvested and processed. And then, Alentejo is famous also for its gastronomic traditions, particularly heartier fare such as pork products, cheese, and especially bread. So while we're here let's tuck into a simple but very tasty lunch on the farm.

After we leave the cork forests we are headed back to the city to explore one of its most famous landmarks, Belém Tower, and the surrounding Belém neighborhood. Andreia will meet us there to explain the history of this important area where the iconic tower stands as a strong monument to Portugal's seafaring past. Then

she'll treat us to the most famous pastel de nata in all the land. If you're unfamiliar with pastel de nata you are in for a treat, these little custard tarts are a perfect sweet snack and they are ubiquitous here.

Tonight is a free evening. For those who would like, you may stay on near Belém to visit the happening LX Factory arts complex where former industrial warehouses have been turned into art galleries, cafes, design shops and you'll find one of the most atmospheric book stores in the city.

Tradition in the City DAY 3: TUESDAY SEPTEMBER 29

- · Roll up your sleeves and enjoy a hands-on pastry class
- · Nosh on regional small plates during an unforgettable performance

There are so many interesting things to see and do in Lisbon and today the city is your oyster. Maybe you'd like to visit one of the fabulous art museums here, take a cruise on the Targus River, or just shop and chill and enjoy the famously good vibes.

In the late afternoon we will reconvene to swap stories about our days as we head to a nearby bakery dubbed the "Nata'lier" for a hands-on pastel de nata baking class. Get an apron on and get ready to bake... in the end you'll take home the skills and secrets required to make these delectable pastries yourself.

Tonight we have an exciting evening in store - an authentic fado show with dinner at Associação do Fado Casto. Be ready for a late night, as the experience doesn't even begin until 9pm. We'll show up a little bit early for a personal welcome and introduction from a member of the family of fadistas who run this temple to the quintessential Lisbon musical artform which even has a UNESCO World Heritage designation. Fado has an enchanting, melancholic sound, exploring the "untranslatable" emotion called saudade - best described as the feeling of deep nostalgia that is accompanied by a glimmer of joy and gratitude for living an experience that can produce such longing. This will be a truly special and memorable outing!

Splendor of Days Gone By day 4: wednesday september 30

- Take in views of a colorful mountaintop storybook-style castle
- · Explore the favorite holiday village of past Portuguese aristocrats

Sleep in a little bit today and then we're taking a day trip to Sintra with Andreia. Sintra is a wealthy municipality close to Lisbon, and it's one of the most famous places in Portugal for good reason. Here we'll find an eclectic collection of 19th century Romantic architectural masterpieces, as well as an 8th century Moorish castle, perched upon a mountaintop amid the scenic Serra de Estrelas.

First we'll visit the terraces and gardens of the resplendent Pena Palace, Sintra's premier destination and a real jewelbox of a complex, featuring vibrantly painted, ornate architecture that is truly unique. After we've explored this storybook castle we'll go into the village for lunch together followed by some free time to stroll and explore. Later in the afternoon, regroup to visit the Quinta da Regaleira, a manor house of impossibly elaborate construction set amid almost ten acres of fancifully designed grounds. Mid-morning we're catching the fast train out of Lisbon. Relax on the comfortable ride as you take in the scenic views and nosh on a packed lunch and in less than three hours you'll be in Porto.

For the next four nights we're staying in the heart of the city at a very unique hotel, the Porto A.S. 1829 Hotel. Located in a former paper warehouse cum stationer's shop, which also once housed its own bookbinding, typography and carpentry workshops, this historic property was recently renovated with an eye to the past. The legacy of the Araújo & Sobrinho Papeleria has been thoughtfully woven into the guest experience. Once we reach the city, we'll leave our bags at the hotel, in its super central and walkable location, and set out on a walking tour of charming Porto. As we wander the narrow lanes, admiring tiled and timbered exteriors, we'll be immersed in the historical signifance and modern energy of this captivating place.

As the day ends, we'll check in to the hotel and enjoy a little downtime before we head out for a delicious dinner together.

Drinking in the Landscape DAY 6: FRIDAY OCTOBER 2

- · Immerse yourself in the scenery as you cruise the Douro River
- · Raise a glass in the world's oldest demarcated wine region

We are leaving the city behind today for the bucolic paradise of the Douro River Valley where we'll find the blue green river snaking through vibrant green steep slopes of terraced vineyards here amid this designated UNESCO World Heritage Cultural Landscape where wine has been produced for over 2,000 years.

During our time in the Alto Douro we'll embark on a private cruise down the river, wine glass in hand, so we can watch this spectacular scenery gently unfold all around us. We will also visit a top wine estate for wine tasting and lunch. It's possible we'll take part in a harvest experience (think grape stomping) but we won't be able to confirm that until the dates are closer as Mother Nature will have the final say on when that will take place.

Return to Porto in the early evening, happy and tired, and spend a relaxing evening however you like.

Fish Market Immersion

DAY 7: SATURDAY OCTOBER 3

- · Stroll along the beach promenade beside the great Atlantic Ocean
- · Choose fresh-as-can-be fish from the market and enjoy it for lunch

This morning we're headed to the seaside town of Matosinhos, just a short drive from Porto, where maritime culture still reigns supreme and the seafood on offer is literally as fresh as it gets. We'll begin our time there with a stop at a historic bakery, beloved since the 19th century. Enjoy a *cimbalino* (Portuguese espresso) with a *bolo de arroz* (rice cake) or *torrada* (toasted bread), a perfect introduction to Matosinhos' warm local vibe.

Then we're going to visit the Matosinhos Municipal Market, where locals barter for the freshest seafood, from sardines to octopus. Immerse yourself in the lively atmosphere, chatting with vendors and sampling Atlantic delicacies. We will choose and purchase some fish together and we're off to one of the town's famous fish restaurants where they will prepare our selection for us... a lunch to remember!

We'll finish our day in Matosinhos with a guided tour at Conservas Pinhais & Cia, an iconic canned fish factory where we'll discover Portugal's famous conserves tradition. Watch how the highest quality sardines and mackerel are hand-packed in tins, which are then wrapped in pretty paper, as they have been for over 100 years. Everyone in the group will get to wrap their own souvenir tin. We'll end our visit with a tasting of Pinhais' premium fish paired with rustic bread and local wine.

Back in the center of Porto tonight, enjoy a free evening.

Braga & a View to Remember DAY 8: SUNDAY OCTOBER 4

- Visit a place immortalized in one of the most famous Myths
- · Raise a glass to your travel companions over a delicious dinner

Today we will visit the oldest city in Portugal and one of the main centers of Christian religious tradition in the whole of the Iberian Peninsula, Braga. A place that has retained its relevance for millennia, the history of the municipality dates back over 2,000 years to the time of the Ancient Romans and today it is one of the country's most dynamic cities with a booming tech scene attracting new residents from around the country and even the wider world.

Our first stop is the striking pilgrimage site just outside the city, Bom Jesus do Monte, a Catholic shrine which was built over a period of 600 years into the slope of Mount Espino, with its main basilica dating to the mid-18th century. You may choose to climb the 573 steps up the Stairway of the Five Senses, the grand Baroque staircase that leads to the heart of the complex, of you can ride up a funicular. Enjoy sweeping views over Braga and the surrounding region; on a clear day you can see all the way to the Atlantic Ocean.

After we've left the sanctuary we'll head to the historic center of Braga for some free time to have lunch, shop, and explore. The city is home to numerous basilicas, gardens, historical museums as well as some great restaurants and shops.

We'll be back in Porto in time for some free time there this afternoon, too, and then tonight our group will enjoy one last delightful and fun meal together at our farewell dinner - toast your group to the lovely week you've just spent together in charming and historic Portugal!
